## **First Phone Call Sample Script**

This is a sample of how your first contact with your student might go. With an ESL student, it is important to speak slowly. With any student, be careful to use simple vocabulary.

Teacher: Hello. May I please speak to Consuela?
Student: Consuela is me. Who is this?
T: This is I am from the Literacy Council. I am your new English teacher. Did someone tell you I would call?
S: Yes, but my English not good. Can you talk slower, please?
T: Yes. Is it ok to talk now?
S: Yes, is OK.
T: I am happy to be your teacher. We will have lessons using a phone or computer. Do you have a smartphone or a computer that you can use?
S: I have iPhone. I can FaceTime.
T: That is good. We can have good lessons on FaceTime. I would like to set up a regular time to call. When can you meet with me for 30 minutes?
S: I can meet at morning time.
T: Morning is good for me, too. Let's plan a first lesson time. I will tell you a little about me and ask you some questions about you. I would like to know more about your education and what you want to learn. Later, we can decide if we want to meet one time or two times a week. Can I call you on FaceTime tomorrow at 10:00?
S: That is good. Yes, tomorrow at 10.
T: Good. Please add me to your Contacts in case you need to call or text me. Or you can write down my phone number. Do you have a pencil and paper to write with?
S: Yes. I can write.
T: It is 888-555-1234. Can you read it back to me?
S: 888-555-1234.

T: That's right. I will call you on FaceTime tomorrow at 10. Good-bye-

S: Goodbye. Thank you.
