

Literacy Council History - Tutoring for Detention Center Inmates

In July 1982, Norman Paul, a retired engineer from Johns Hopkins, became a certified tutor and began "a second career" that would last for 20 years. His efforts began at the old South Street Jail where he tutored students four days a week.

In 1990 he launched a project where inmates who had achieved literacy went on to tutor other inmates. In 2001 alone, 68 students were tutored. Twenty attained their GEDs and five received 8th grade diplomas. In the course of 20 years, Norm brought literacy to at least 400



people. He continued tutoring the incarcerated until 2002, shortly before his passing.
