Literacy Council History - Marguerite Naseau Literacy Center, Emmitsburg

In 1991, Sister Mary Jerome McGinley of the Provincial House in Emmitsburg was certified as a tutor. As an influential educator and fund-raiser in the community, one of her notable contributions was establishing the Marguerite Naseau Literacy Center at the Provincial House. This center served as a satellite location of the Literacy Council of Frederick County until it closed in 2002.
