## Community Classes

**Beginning, Intermediate and Advanced Conversation Classes** are for adults who want to improve their ability to speak and understand American English. Practice conversation skills and pronunciation while learning about holidays, food, travels, family, life skills, current events, American history, common idioms, and more.

**Writing 1:** This class will review sentence building and vocabulary, and students will work on a paragraph.

**Writing 2:** This class will focus on writing different kinds of paragraphs such as opinion and descriptive paragraphs.

**High Intermediate/Advanced Workplace Conversation Online:** This class is for intermediate to advanced English learners who want to practice conversations in the workplace. Topics will cover how to understand and practice American culture, HR conversations, appropriate colleague conversation, introducing yourself, etc.

**Advanced Student-Led Conversation Online:** This is for high intermediate to advanced students. Students give presentations and mini presentations about their country of origin, first year in the US, or other topics of interest. Class content will cover idioms, pronunciation, and small group discussions.

## Workforce Development Classes

**Career Exploration Class** is for adult English learners at a low-intermediate level or higher who want to find a job, change careers, learn about new career options or improve their soft skills.

## Life Skills Classes

**Life Skills: Beginner Digital Literacy** is for students with an intermediate to native level of English, and a beginner level of digital literacy. Topics include the basics of Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Zoom meetings, and other topics per students' requests.

**Life Skills: Advanced Writing** is for students with advanced English or native English speakers. Topics may include academic, business, or GED-focused essay writing.
