## ESL Classes

**Beginning, Intermediate and Advanced Conversation Classes** are for adults who want to improve their ability to speak and understand American English. Practice conversation skills and pronunciation while learning about holidays, food, travels, family, life skills, current events, American history, common idioms, and more.

**Intermediate Pronunciation Class** is for adults who want to improve their English pronunciation through minimal pair practice. Students will practice the sounds of English consonants and vowels.

**Advanced Student-Led Conversation:** This class is truly student-led. A facilitator will go over group discussion skills on the first day of class and provide resources for discussion topics. Students will sign up to take turns leading discussions for future classes. The facilitator will not be present for future classes, and students will work together to facilitate lively discussion.

## Life Skills Classes

**Life Skills: Microsoft Office** is for students with a high intermediate to native level of English, and a beginner level of digital literacy. Topics include the basics of Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and other topics per students' requests.

**Life Skills: Basic Digital Literacy** is for students with a high intermediate to native level of English, and a basic level of digital literacy. Topics include the basics of turning on a computer and Google suite.

**Life Skills: Math 1** is for students with a high intermediate to native level of English and working towards their GED. Topics include whole numbers, decimals, fractions, percents, and measurements.
