ESL Classes

Multi-Level, Beginning, Intermediate and Advanced Conversation Classes are for adults who want to improve their ability to speak and understand American English. Practice conversation skills and pronunciation while learning about holidays, food, travels, family, life skills, current events, American history, common idioms, and more.

Advanced Student-Led Conversation: This is for high intermediate to advanced students. Students give presentations and mini presentations about their country of origin, first year in the US, or other topics of interest. Class content will cover idioms, pronunciation, and small group discussions.

Writing 1: This class will review sentence building and vocabulary, and students will work on writing a paragraph.

Writing 2: This class will focus on writing different kinds of paragraphs such as opinion and descriptive paragraphs.

Life Skills Classes

Microsoft Office for Intermediate Users is for students with a high intermediate to native level of English or native English speakers and have knowledge of basic Excel formulas.

Basic Digital Literacy is for students with a high intermediate to native level of English or native English speakers, and a basic level of digital literacy. Topics include the basics of turning on a computer and Google suite. Students need to bring their cell phone and Google email password.

Math 1 is for students with a high intermediate to native level of English who are working towards their GED. Topics include whole numbers, decimals, fractions, percents, and measurements.

Math 2 is for students with high intermediate English or native English speakers who are working towards their GED or interested in a math review and have completed the topics covered in Math 1. Topics include Algebraic thinking, Data Analysis, and Probability.

Scientific Reasoning, Practices, and Data Analysis is for students with a high intermediate or native English speakers and are working towards their GED or looking for a science review.

Bank on your Success is a financial literacy class for students with high intermediate English and native English speakers. This class goes over how you can approach your personal and business finances with an emphasis on budgeting.

Women Building Success is a welcoming and encouraging course designed to help women recognize their strengths, build confidence, and develop practical skills for the workplace and everyday life. Through supportive conversations and interactive activities, participants will strengthen communication, professionalism, interviewing, goal setting, and self-confidence as they take positive steps toward their personal and professional goals. This online class is for high intermediate English learners and native English speakers.

Workforce Development Classes

Certification Classes are for adults who are high intermediate to advanced English learners or native English speakers that want to expand their career readiness by earning a kitchen cook or guest services certification.
